How to Become a CHAP Worker

- Visit our website or call to find out about requirements and responsibilities of a CHAP worker.
- Complete the worker application form (available on our website) and submit your resume. Only those deemed qualified will be contacted for an intake meeting.
- Provide three reference letters using the forms available on the website.
- Provide a police reference check and a vulnerable persons check. Payment to the Police Service is your responsibility.
- Attend a CHAP orientation session.

Note: Workers on the registry are not employees of the CHAP Program and are considered self-employed.
